



What you need

- newly fallen leaves of different colors, shapes, and sizes
- construction paper
- newspapers
- glue
- heavy books

What you do

- 1. Gather some leaves and put them between layers of newspapers. Pile heavy books on top.
- 2. In a week, the leaves will be flat and dry. Arrange the leaves on construction paper. Think about different animals and try to create their shapes.
- 3. Tear off leaf pieces to make eyes and other small features.
- 4. When you are happy with a leafy creature, glue the leaves onto the paper.
